



Moffitt Angus Farms is a third-generation, family-orientated operation that is conveniently located a quarter mile south of Interstate-80 at exit 159 in central Iowa. Craig is a graduate of Iowa State University. He is married to Jessica and they have two children, Jillian and James.

Lucas W. Young, Scottsbluff, NE., is the feed yard manager for High Plains Feed Yard Inc. which is a custom cattle feeding operation north of Scottsbluff. Lucas and his wife, Susan, who is also at the feed yard, have two children, Daniel, 10, and Ellery, 15 months. Daniel is very active in showing market beef and breeding beef as well as rodeo. Plains Junior Hereford Show held during
the Red River Valley Fair in West Fargo,
ND.

Each consignor will contribute \$20 per heifer consigned in this sale along with each junior who intends to compete in either of these two shows. The money will be split and paid out according to how many show in either of these two shows. Also, the association has agreed to pay all ND addressed juniors \$20 per head at these two shows when leaving the ring.

The NDHA sponsors Hereford steer premiums each year at the ND Junior Hereford field day held during the ND State Fair in Minot, ND and at the Great Plains Regional Junior Hereford Show held in July during the Red River Valley Fair, West Fargo, ND.

The NDHA will pay \$200 for champion and \$100 for reserve champion steers for the NDJHA filed day event. They must be from a registered sire and dam with the AHA.

The Great Plains Junior Hereford Show pays as follows:

- Grand Champion Market Steer Award & \$157.50
- Reserve Grand Champion Market
 Steer Award & \$78.75
- Breeder of Champion Steer Award & \$78.75
- Breeder of Reserve Champion Steer Award & \$15.75

There is also a junior show featuring a Hereford steer show during the Midwest Classic Jr. Hereford Show in Pipestone, MN in June 2020.

HEREFORD JUNIOR GRANT PROGRAM



The North Dakota Hereford Association has set up a grant program for juniors who apply and are selected for the grants. The grant money of \$250 is to be used toward the purchase of a Hereford animal from the 2019 NSC Hereford Sale. The grant is not transferable and does not carry over to the next year. There will be three \$250 grants awarded.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Current Member of the ND Junior Hereford Association. (Annual membership fee of \$10 may be sent with the grant application.)
- 2. As of January 1, 2019 applicant must be at least 8 years old and not older than 21.
- 3. Must be able to provide at least equal to or greater than the amount of the grant purchase the Hereford animal.
- 4. Must purchase a Hereford from the NSC Hereford Sale to be held December 7, 2019 at the ND Winter Show Building in Valley City, ND.
- 5. Recipient of the grant must be present at the sale in order to use the grant.
- 6. Recipient agrees to abide by the rules of the Futurity Show and the 4-H code of ethics.
