

North Dakota State Crop Show Exhibitor Guide

The 2025 North Dakota State Crop Show is on February 28th, 2025 at the North Dakota Winter Show in Valley City, ND

General Rules and Regulations for Exhibitors

1. Any North Dakota resident may exhibit a crop sample grown in North Dakota from either the 2023 or 2024 growing season.

2. An exhibitor can only enter in <u>one division</u>, either the open, 4-H or FFA division. No person shall be permitted to enter more than one exhibit of the same variety in any one lot. The exhibitor must indicate the divison on the official entry tag.

3. Exhibitors must state on the entry tag the class, lot number and the kind and variety/ hybrid name under which the entry is to be judged. The officials in charge of exhibits, or the judges, reserve the right to make any corrections in class or lot numbers in case of errors.

4. All samples much be properly labeled with the official entry tag. A copy of the entry tag can be found in this booklet or online on the Winter Show website at: www.northdakotawintershow.com/wintershow-cropshow.

5. **All** samples and sheaves become the property of the North Dakota State Crop Show Committee and will not be returned. Extension Agents or FFA Advisors can request samples for educational purposes by completing a request form available from the Winter Show office. The sample request form is due **when samples are dropped off.** Samples **must** be picked up Monday following the conclusion of the Winter Show during office hours.

6. Entry deadline and sample drop-off is noon Wednesday, February 24, 2025.

Judging will be on Friday, February 28th, 2025.

If an exhibitor is unable to transport or mail a sample to the ND Crop Show, exhibitors are able to drop off samples at one of the following drop-off locations:

- Beulah High School, 204 5th St. NW, Beulah, By noon on Saturday, February 22, 2025
- Lisbon High School, 502 Ash Street, Lisbon, By noon on Saturday, February 22, 2025
- Carrington Ag Education Department, 100 3rd Ave South, Carrington, **By 6:00 pm on** Tuesday, February 25, 2025

• North Dakota Winter Show, 700 7th St SE, Valley City, **By noon on Wednesday**, February 26, 2025 (entry deadline)

7. The North Dakota State Crop Show management will not be responsible for loss, damage, or mixture of any entry, but will exercise reasonable precaution at all times.

8. The following minimum quantities will be required for all entries for all divisions.

- Two quarts ~ Wheat, durum, oats, barley, sunflower, rye, pea, lentil, bean and shelled corn
- One quart ~ Flax, canola, small seeded legumes, millet, and seeds of similar size
- Ear Corn ~ Ten ears

9. Small grain sheaves should measure 2 ½ to 3 inches in diameter halfway between the butt and the head of the sheave. Sheaves should be tied firmly and securely in three to four places.

10. Entries not meeting the minimum requirements will be disqualified.

11. The management reserves the right, and the judges are authorized to reject any exhibits which in their opinion are deemed undesirable or not properly exhibited or represented. Commercially prepared seed, treated seed, unclean or bin run seed will be disqualified.

12. The best blue-ribbon entries from all three divisions within each lot will compete for the lot Championship premium money and awards.

13. Grade premium money for FFA and 4-H divisions will be: Blue – \$5; Red – \$3; White – \$1

14. A \$10 premium will be awarded to the 1st place blue ribbon exhibits in the 4-H, FFA and Open division per lot.

15. Championship premiums will be awarded to the top six exhibits across all divisions based on sponsorships:

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

The 2025 North Dakota State Crop Show is dedicated to Greg Endres.


Greg received his B.S. and M.S. degrees in plant sciences from NDSU. He began his career with NDSU Extension as assistant agriculture and natural resources agent in Ramsey County in July 1983 and then served as an agent in Rolette County from 1985 to 1990. He has been an Extension agronomist and cropping systems specialist at the Carrington Research Extension Center since 1990. He recently retired from NDSU Extension in May 2024.



The primary focus of his work has been providing support to Extension agents for their crop production education programs. He also provided training events such as the Advanced Crop Advisers Workshop and Gettingit-Right in Crop Production series for crop advisers and farmers. His research and education efforts have involved most North Dakota crops but focused primarily on wheat, soybean and dry bean production.

In addition, he also had a passion for teaching the next generation. He was a member of the ND Crop Show planning committee and has served as a ND Crop Show judge for several years. The ND Crop Show committee has valued his dedication and time he put toward the ND Crop Show.

Greg will be honored at the North Dakota Winter South Exhibit building at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, March 5th, 2025 during the Crop Show awards ceremony.




